

MEURSAULT BOUCHERES PREMIER CRU Meursault Bouchères

The appellation Meursault Bouchères covers only 4 ha $\frac{1}{2}$ and is situated in the north of the Genevrières, on the superior part of the same hill and so has a very good exposure. The origin of the name comes from the fact that in that place there used to be a lot of bushes called "bouchons".

This climate produces wines that remind the taste of the Genevrières, very fine, elegant, with floral reminescences. They are however nervous with a fairly suppleness like its neighbour.

The Domaine Latour-Giraud owns 14 ares in this very charming climate.
