

## PULIGNY-MONTRACHET CHAMPS CANET 1ER CRU Puligny Montrachet Champs Canet

Puligny-Montrachet is situated in the south of Meursault and in the north of Chassagne Montrachet, and shares with Chassagne the greatest white wines vineyards of the world. Grands Crus such as Montrachet and Bâtard-Montrachet are on both villages. Those of Chevalier-Montrachet and Bienvenues-Bâtard Montrachet are situated only on Puligny. On the 235 hectares of A.O.C. vineyards, 21 hectares are occupied by those 4 Grands Crus, and 100 hectares more represent the eleven 1er Crus. Only 300 hl of red wines are produced in the entire appellation average per year.

Originally a "Gallo-Romain" village, "Pulinacius" is mentioned in ancient documents of the Pope Urbain II in 1905. It became Puligny-Montrachet in 1879. Its prominence as a producer of white wine is relatively recent; in the early plants were Gamay, later supplanted by wheat, cassis and blackberries.

The 1er Cru vineyard of Champs Canet spread over Meursault Perrières and covers 4 hectares. Similarly to the "Chambertin", its name seems to come from the first owner; "Les Champs de Canet". Characteristic of the first vintages of the north, it produces wines that are delicate rather than sumptuous.

The Domaine Latour-Giraud owns 34 ares of vineyards, in the north of this climate, planted on stony thin soils. They produce a very elegant and fine wine with a slight flowery bouquet, with a supple texture, sophisticated smoky nuances with almond notes at the end.

Gastronomy: go well with sea fish and seafood
